Playing in Mike & The Mechanics and playing the The Genesis gig, how do you as a professional drummer approach this?

I mean they're kind of two different gigs, they require two different approaches. Really I mean at the end of the day you're approaching it as a hired musician, so you've got to go in with the mindset of you have to do. What's best for the music, not what's best for you.


You have to do what's right for the band, but, especially as a drummer, make them feel comfortable, especially with Genesis, where the band has so many complicated parts. You want to make sure that you can, that you've done your homework and you have a good base so that they can do what they need to do on top of that and not have to worry about what's going on back there.

And then also listening to both the live recordings, whatever they've done most recently and also going back to the records, finding some cool stuff that's been lost over the years.

What influence has your dad (Phil Collins) had on you and what's your unique sound that you feel like is what people know you for?

Yeah, I think with my dad, obviously I grew up watching him and he was like my first drum hero, and doing his gig as well as the Genesis gig, you end up becoming influenced almost not even by choice. You're just around it and you're immersed in it, so definitely.

I think something that I've tried to always keep in mind from him and something he influenced me by, is being expressive behind the kit. Not always trying to overthink what you're doing, and sometimes I fail at that.



Sometimes I overthink way too much, but you know, as all drummers do. But I think definitely you need to focus on feeling what the music is and what the music needs and not getting too focused on the time signatures or whatever. But from him, I think there's definitely that Prog influence and even now later on I've started becoming a bit more influenced by some of his Fusion stuff like when he was doing Brand X.

As for my sound, I mean I don't think I have a sound yet that people would know me for. I mean, I'm still pretty young and finding my feet.





I also have really become inspired by the metal world and drummers like Danny Carey and even more recently by some really heavy bands, and trying to get my double kick chops up. Guys like Mario from Gojira and Eloy from Slipknot. There's always new things to learn.

There's definitely a big rock influence from when I was a kid, Taylor Hawkins, Dave Grohl, Chad Smith. It's always growing, there's always different guys that come into the fold, so I think it's kind of a bit of a mix but at the end of the day, I'm definitely a more heavy-hitting rock drummer, more so than a a jazz guy or something. That being said, there's plenty of jazz that comes in and influences me from time to time as well.



What are your future plans, what are your goals and what other projects do you have going on?

I've got a new project going on now with my my longtime bandmates, who I've been playing music with since I was about 13 years old. We've been in different bands and we got a new project now, with a brilliant singer called Evan Conrad, and we're just finishing up the recording of our album now. So hopefully by the summer, I hope, it's out.

And as soon as we're done with this Mechanics run, which is quite a long one, but I'm hoping to hit the ground running with with my band and taking it out on the road and doing a thing. That's really where my passion is, being part of a band and writing songs with people. Obviously I love doing gigs and being hired to play for different bands, that's given me so much experience and so much education, about music and not only actual music, but how the music business world works. So yeah, just wanting to take all that and kind of do my own thing, that's that's the dream really.



Unfortunately as a drummer, I don't really approach them that differently. Which can be a problem, because I end up hitting as heavy as I would in an arena as I am in a pub. But I will approach it with the same mentality and professionalism. It is important I think it sets certain precedents that you can follow that are healthy and professional. It helps everybody when you turn up professionally, whether you're doing a pub gig a club gig or an arena show, approaching it with the same amount of professionalism.

But that being said, they are different and sometimes in a way going with any band that I've played in doing the smaller gigs where you don't have the decades of a catalog to fall back on, you almost feel more pressure because people are here to see you.

With Genesis or my dad, the people are there to hear the music that they know, I'm just there to deliver a job as a drummer. Whereas when it's your own project, you feel you got to win the crowd over and then you're worried the lights, the sound, are people even going to turn up?

It is quite different, but I'm used to it, and I love it! Like we did the last Genesis tour, we finished the three nights at the O2 Arena and a week later I was playing some random tiny little gig in Florida, where there's like 17 people.

Talk us through your cymbal setup.

Left to right, I've got a 19" HHX Thin Crash, and then underneath that I've got a 10" AAX Ozone Splash. And then my two main crashes are a 19" HHX Thin Complex crash and a 20" Thin Complex, on the other side, so kind of the same but just you know one's a bit bigger!

22" HHX Legacy Ride, and then an 18" HHX Ozone, and in front of me is a 12" Artisan Splash. On my far right is a 21" Holy China, and for hats I use the 15" Artisan Hats. They're my favorite hats and my favorite cymbal is the 21" China in the small pub! I take it anywhere, it doesn't matter, I mean it knocks a couple decibels over everybody's hearing every time I hit it, but it's definitely my favorite cymbal of of all time.

I've been with Sabian since I started out playing cymbals and they've always been so great to me, and just the range of what they give as far as sounds and what you can go for. There's some cymbals that I use on every gig and then there's some cymbals that I'll swap out, because sometimes in a big arena show you want one that cuts through the mix but then in a smaller venue you want a darker cymbal. And also depending on what's needed, you know, with my band there's quite a lot of crashing going on, so a darker cymbal is not as abrasive as like a bright cymbal.





WHEN IT'S TIME TO TAKE YOUR GUITAR TO A PROPER LUTHIER



We love our guitars, don't we? They're extensions of ourselves, partners in our musical journeys. But like any well-loved instrument, guitars require maintenance and, sometimes, more serious attention. While some adjustments and tweaks can be handled at home, there are times when you need to call in the professionals – the luthiers. So, when exactly do you cross that line and seek the expertise of a qualified luthier? Let's break it down.

MAJOR STRUCTURAL DAMAGE

This is a no-brainer. If your guitar has suffered a significant impact, like a cracked neck, a broken headstock, or a large dent in the body, it's time to visit a luthier. These types of repairs require specialized tools, knowledge of wood properties, and experience in structural restoration. Trying to fix them yourself could lead to further damage or a less-than-ideal repair.



NECK ISSUES BEYOND A SIMPLE TRUSS ROD ADJUSTMENT

- Twisted Neck: Where the neck is warped along its length.
- Back Bow: Where the neck is bowed backward, even after truss rod adjustments.
- Uneven Relief: Where the neck has varying degrees of bow along its length.
- Fret Buzz That Persists: After basic setups.



FRETWORK THAT'S BEYOND POLISHING

- Worn-Down Frets: Causing buzzing and intonation problems.
- Uneven Fret Height: Leading to inconsistent playability.
- Loose Frets: That can cause buzzing and intonation problems.



INTONATION PROBLEMS THAT WON'T GO AWAY

Intonation refers to how accurately your guitar plays in tune across the fretboard. If you've tried adjusting the bridge saddles and still experience significant intonation issues, it could indicate a more serious problem, like a warped neck, a faulty bridge, or improperly placed frets. A luthier can diagnose and resolve these issues.

ELECTRICAL PROBLEMS THAT ARE MORE THAN A LOOSE WIRE

- Faulty Pickups: That need rewinding or replacement.
- Malfunctioning Switches or Pots: That require specialized knowledge to repair or replace.
- Buzzing or Grounding Problems: That persist after basic troubleshooting



CUSTOM MODIFICATIONS OR UPGRADES

- Installing new pickups.
- Changing the bridge or nut.
- Refinishing the body.

WHEN YOU JUST WANT A PROFESSIONAL SETUP

Even if your guitar doesn't have any major problems, a professional setup by a luthier can significantly improve its playability and sound. A setup includes:

- · Truss rod adjustment.
- Fret leveling (if needed).
- Nut and bridge adjustments.
- Intonation.
- · String height adjustment.



Knowing when to take your guitar to a luthier is essential for maintaining its health and playability. Don't be afraid to seek professional help when needed. A good luthier can be your guitar's best friend, ensuring that it continues to sing beautifully for years to come.
