




# ADAMAUDIO AZV



The ADAM Audio A7V studio monitor is a significant evolution of the award-winning A7X, establishing itself as a potential new industry standard in nearfield monitoring. Designed as a versatile 2-way monitor, it excels in project studios, smaller control rooms, and for anyone prioritizing high-quality audio at a competitive price point.

Right out of the box, the build quality feels substantial and professional. They've got a clean, modern aesthetic that fits right into my studio setup. But looks are only skin deep, right? The real magic happens when you fire them up.



The clarity and detail I'm getting from the A7Vs are seriously impressive. The high-frequency reproduction, thanks to ADAM's renowned X-ART tweeter, is just stunning. It's crisp and open without ever sounding harsh or fatiguing, which is crucial during those long mixing sessions. I'm hearing nuances in tracks I thought I knew inside and out – subtle reverb tails, delicate fingerpicking, all the little things that add depth and character.

The mid-range is equally articulate. Vocals sit perfectly in the mix, and instruments have a real sense of presence. There's no muddiness or congestion, just a clear and defined sonic picture. This makes critical listening and making precise EQ adjustments so much easier.

For a nearfield monitor of this size, the A7Vs deliver a surprising amount of punch and extension. The bass is tight and controlled, not boomy or flabby. I can really get a good sense of what's happening in the low frequencies, which is essential for getting the foundation of a track right.

What I appreciate most about these monitors is their overall balance and neutrality. They're not trying to flatter the sound; they're giving me an honest and accurate representation of what's there. This is exactly what you need when you're mixing or mastering – a reliable reference that you can trust to translate well across different playback systems.

The imaging is also spot on. I can easily pinpoint the placement of instruments within the stereo field, creating a really immersive listening experience. This level of detail helps in making crucial panning decisions and crafting a well-defined soundstage.





Of course, no piece of gear is absolutely perfect. While the A7Vs offer fantastic low-end extension for their size, if you're working heavily with sub-bass frequencies, you might still want to consider adding a dedicated subwoofer. However, for most nearfield monitoring applications, they hold their own remarkably well.

Setting them up was straightforward, and they offer enough connectivity options to integrate easily into most studio environments. The included acoustic treatment advice in the manual is a nice touch too, emphasizing the importance of your listening space.







Overall, my time with the ADAM Audio A7V studio monitors has been a genuinely positive experience. They offer a fantastic combination of clarity, detail, and balanced frequency response, making them a valuable tool for any serious music producer or audio engineer. They're revealing without being clinical, and they inspire confidence that the decisions I'm making are based on an accurate sonic picture. If you're looking to step up your monitoring game, the A7Vs are definitely worth considering.



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

For DJs, bands playing smaller venues, or presenters needing clear vocal projection, these speakers offer a capable solution.

# SCHECTER - SUNSET-6 EXTREME 'GREY GHOST'



Alright, buckle up, because I've just spent some quality time with the Schecter Sunset 6 Extreme in that killer Grey Ghost finish, and let me tell you, this guitar is a serious contender. For anyone looking for a versatile workhorse that looks as mean as it sounds, this one deserves a long, hard look.

First off, let's talk about aesthetics. The "Grey Ghost" finish is just plain cool. It's this smoky, almost charcoal grey with a subtle wood grain that peeks through, and it's got this satin feel that's just fantastic under your hand. It's not flashy, but it's got this understated aggression that I really dig. Paired with the black hardware and the abalone binding that really pops against the dark finish, this guitar looks like it means business. It's the kind of guitar that turns heads without screaming for attention.

But a guitar is more than just a pretty face, right? The playability of the Sunset 6 Extreme is where it really starts to shine. The maple neck with the thin "C" profile feels incredibly comfortable and fast.



My hand just glided up and down the ebony fretboard. The 14" radius feels just right for both chording and shredding, and the 24 extra-jumbo frets make bending and vibrato a breeze. Schecter really nailed the neck carve on this one – it feels like it was made to be played.



Now, let's get to the heart of the matter: the sound. This guitar is loaded with Schecter Diamond pickups – a Diamond '78 in the bridge and a Diamond '78N in the neck. These aren't your run-of-the-mill humbuckers.

The bridge pickup has this fantastic, thick, and punchy tone that's perfect for rock and metal. It's got plenty of sustain and articulation, so even with high gain, your notes stay clear and defined. It's aggressive when you dig in but cleans up nicely when you roll back the volume.




# SCHECTER - SUNSET-6 EXTREME 'GREY GHOST'

The neck pickup is a different beast altogether. It's warm and smooth, ideal for creamy leads and thick rhythm tones. It's got a real vocal quality to it, especially when you push it a little. The combination of these two pickups offers a huge range of sonic possibilities. Whether I was chugging out heavy riffs, soaring through melodic solos, or even dialing in some cleaner, bluesier tones, the Sunset 6 Extreme delivered.

The controls are straightforward and effective: a master volume, a master tone with a push-pull coil-split, and a three-way pickup selector. The coil-split is a welcome addition, offering even more tonal versatility by giving you access to brighter, single-coil-esque sounds. This really expands the palette of the guitar and makes it surprisingly adaptable to different genres.

The hardware on this thing feels solid and reliable. The Schecter locking tuners are a godsend for maintaining tuning stability, even with some serious whammy bar action (yes, it's got a Floyd Rose Special!). The Floyd Rose Special bridge itself is smooth and responsive, allowing for everything from subtle vibrato to full-on dive bombs without knocking the guitar out of tune. This is a big plus for anyone who likes to get expressive with their playing.

One thing I really appreciated was the attention to detail. The abalone binding not only looks great but feels smooth and comfortable. The fretwork is excellent – the frets are nicely polished and level, leading to a buzz-free playing experience right out of the box.





Are there any downsides? Honestly, it's hard to find many at this price point. Some players might prefer a thicker neck profile, but the thin "C" is definitely a popular and comfortable choice for many. And while the Floyd Rose is fantastic for what it does, it might not be everyone's cup of tea if you prefer a more traditional hardtail bridge.



Overall, the Schecter Sunset 6 Extreme in Grey Ghost is a seriously impressive guitar. It offers killer looks, fantastic playability, a wide range of powerful tones, and rock-solid hardware, all at a price that won't break the bank. Whether you're a seasoned shredder or a versatile player looking for a reliable and inspiring instrument, the Sunset 6 Extreme deserves a spot on your shortlist. It's a guitar that begs to be played, and it delivers the goods every time you plug it in. Trust me, this "Grey Ghost" is one you'll want haunting your guitar collection.



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
